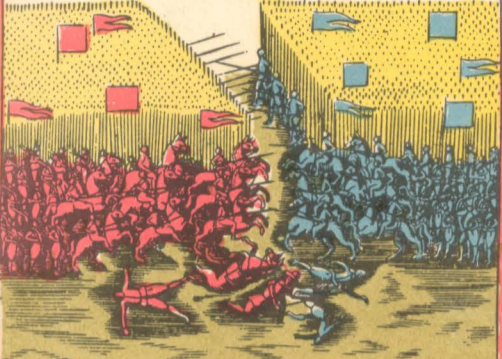
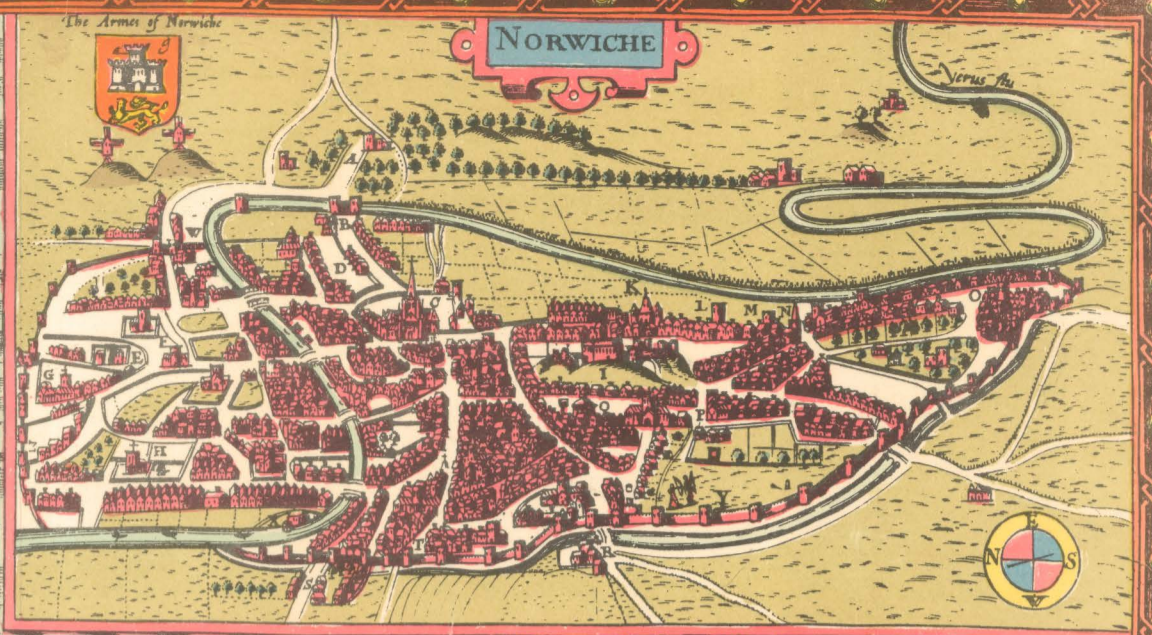


NORTH

FLORISHING NOBLE FAMILIES  
& POPVLOVS AS HAVE BORNE  
DESCRIBED THE TITLES  
AND DEVIDED THEROF.



With two severall and insurrections hath this Countie of Norfolk bene visited the first comencd by John Litstard Duke of Northampton calling himselfe kinge of the Commons who led byre thousand Souldiers into the field, and forsooke the Lord Morley and Scals to serve him at his table with other Knights beside, but was lastly overthrowne by Henry Spenser knyght of Norwiche and worthily hanged. An. 1382.  
The other was under the leading of Robert Ket Tannar of Wingham, who in a conflict forced the Lord William Parr Marquis of Northampton to flight, and slew the Lord Shesfeld in the field, but after many outrages done to the cite of Norwiche was taken by John Dudley Earle of Warwiche, having syc thousand of his followers slaine and himselfe hangd upon the toppe of the Cytie. 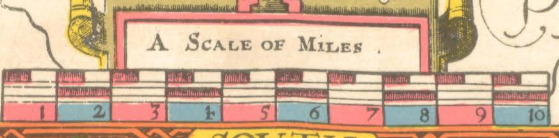
